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**AN ACT**

To provide for the ordinary expenses of the Executive Judicial and Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth interest on the public debt and the support of the public schools for the two fiscal years beginning June first one thousand nine hundred and nineteen and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending May thirty-first one thousand nine hundred and nineteen

1 Section 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-*  
2 *sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly*  
3 *met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same That*  
4 *the following sums or so much thereof as may be neces-*  
5 *sary be and the same are hereby specifically appropriated*  
6 *to the several objects hereinafter named for the two fiscal*  
7 *years commencing on the first day of June one thousand*  
8 *nine hundred and nineteen and for the payment of bills*  
9 *incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal*

1 year ending May thirty-first one thousand nine hundred and  
 2 nineteen to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury  
 3 not otherwise appropriated

4 Section 2 For the payment of the salaries of the several  
 5 State officers the clerks and employes in the several de-  
 6 partments of the State Government and for the incidental  
 7 expenses of the said departments the following sums or  
 8 so much thereof as may be necessary the same to be  
 9 paid on the warrant of the Auditor General upon the State  
 10 Treasurer in the amounts as follows and in the manner  
 11 prescribed by law

#### 12 EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

##### 13 Office of Governor

14 For the payment of the salary of the Governor two  
 15 years the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000)

16 For the payment of clerk hire two years the sum of  
 17 fifty thousand three hundred and sixty dollars (\$50,360)

18 For the contingent expenses including clerical and steno-  
 19 graphic charges for the Executive Department and the travel-  
 20 ing expenses of the Secretary to the Governor for the  
 21 two fiscal years beginning June first one thousand nine  
 22 hundred and nineteen the sum of twelve thousand dollars  
 23 (\$12,000)

24 For the payment of the traveling and the incidental  
 25 expenses of the Governor the miscellaneous expenses in-  
 26 curred in the conduct and management of the Executive  
 27 Mansion for the two fiscal years beginning June first one  
 28 thousand nine hundred and nineteen and for the payment  
 29 of like expenses incurred and remaining unpaid prior to

1 June first one thousand nine hundred and nineteen the  
2 sum of twenty-four thousand dollars (\$24,000) or so much  
3 thereof as may be necessary to be expended at the dis-  
4 cretion of the Governor

5 For the payment of the increase in the salaries of  
6 the employes of the Executive Department as provided in  
7 Senate bill number ninety-nine providing for the reorganiza-  
8 tion of the said Executive Department from the date of  
9 the approval of the said act February twenty-sixth one  
10 thousand nine hundred and nineteen to May thirty-first  
11 one thousand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of two  
12 thousand one hundred forty-nine dollars and eleven cents  
13 (\$2,149.11)

14 Office of Lieutenant Governor

15 For the payment of the salary of the Lieutenant-  
16 Governor two years the sum of ten thousand dollars  
17 (\$10,000)

18 For all contingent expenses including traveling clerical  
19 and stenographic charges of the Lieutenant-Governor for the  
20 two fiscal years beginning June first one thousand nine  
21 hundred and nineteen the sum of two thousand five hun-  
22 dred dollars (\$2,500)

23 EXECUTIVE CONTROLLER DEPARTMENT

24 For the payment of the salary of the Executive Con-  
25 troller two years the sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000)

26 For the payment of the salary of the Assistant Ex-  
27 ecutive Controller two years the sum of three thousand  
28 six hundred dollars (\$3,600)

29 For the payment of the salary of the stenographer

1 and typewriter two years the sum of two thousand dol-  
2 lars (\$2,000)

3 For the payment of contingent expenses extra clerk  
4 hire investigations and traveling expenses two years the  
5 sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000)

6 STATE DEPARTMENT

7 For the payment of the salary of the Secretary of  
8 the Commonwealth two years the sum of sixteen thousand  
9 dollars (\$16,000)

10 For the payment of the salary of the Deputy Secre-  
11 tary of the Commonwealth two years the sum of nine  
12 thousand dollars (\$9,000)

13 For the payment of clerk hire including messenger and  
14 night-watchman two years the sum of one hundred and  
15 thirty-two thousand seven hundred and sixty dollars (\$132,-  
16 760)

17 For the payment of janitor postage express charges  
18 traveling and contingent expenses two years the sum of  
19 fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000)

20 AUDITOR GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT

21 For the payment of the Auditor General two years  
22 the sum of sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000)

23 For the payment of the Auditor General for services  
24 as a member of the Board of Public Grounds and Build-  
25 ings two years the sum of one thousand two hundred  
26 dollars (\$1,200)

27 For the salaries of the Deputy Auditor General As-  
28 sistant Deputy Auditor General Chief Clerks Chief of Bu-  
29 reau of Corporations and Assistants Traveling Auditors Ac-

1 countants Bookkeepers and all other clerks and employes  
2 provided by law the sum of seven hundred sixty-two  
3 thousand two hundred dollars (\$762,200)

4 For the payment of compensation and expenses of per-  
5 sons appointed in prusance of law to examine the ac-  
6 counts of officers or of individuals required by law to  
7 make report to the Auditor General of moneys due the  
8 Commonwealth and for the payment of expenses of depu-  
9 ties and traveling auditors actually and necessarily in-  
10 curred by them in the performance of the duties as-  
11 signed them as provided by law two years the sum of  
12 one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000)

13 For the payment of extra clerks for the purpose of  
14 balancing and transferring accounts making new indices for  
15 rendering any other general assistance to the regular cler-  
16 ical force two years the sum of one hundred thousand  
17 dollars (\$100,000)

18 For the purchase of patent indexes records law books  
19 and other books necessary for the proper conduct of the  
20 work of collecting taxes from corporations and auditing  
21 accounts two years the sum of three thousand dollars  
22 (\$3,000)

23 For the payment of persons employed by the Auditor  
24 General to discover prosecute and collect delinquent corpora-  
25 tion taxes for two years beginning June first one thou-  
26 sand nine hundred and nineteen and for the payment of  
27 persons who have been so employed prior to that date

1 the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or  
2 so much thereof as may be necessary

3 For the payment of the compensation of informants in  
4 escheats as provided for in the act of May second one  
5 thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and amendments  
6 thereto the fees and expenses of escheats and the serv-  
7 ices of attorneys authorized by the Auditor General in  
8 connection with such escheat proceedings and for the re-  
9 fund of moneys to those entitled thereto upon the tra-  
10 verse of decrees in escheat as provided by said act for  
11 the two years beginning June first one thousand nine  
12 hundred and nineteen the sum of twenty-five thousand dol-  
13 lars (\$25,000) or so much thereof as may be necessary

14 For the payment of the costs of publishing in news-  
15 papers and legal periodicals statements containing the  
16 names addresses amount of money or character of prop-  
17 erty as filed in the office of the Auditor General under  
18 the provisions of an act approved the seventh day of  
19 June one thousand nine hundred and fifteen entitled "An  
20 act providing for the escheat of deposits of money or  
21 property of another received for storage or safe keeping  
22 the dividends profits debts and interest on debts of cor-  
23 porations companies banks trust companies insurance com-  
24 panies limited partnerships and partnership associations or-  
25 ganized under the laws of this Commonwealth except mutual  
26 saving fund-society not having a capital stock represented  
27 by shares and except also building and loan associations  
28 and property held for the benefit of another by the  
29 same and the profits accretions and interest on such

1 property as well as interest thereon accrued or which  
2 should have accrued between the fixing of the amount of  
3 such property by the award of any court and the actual  
4 distribution thereof" the sum of one hundred and twenty-  
5 five thousand dollars (\$125,000) or so much thereof as  
6 may be necessary

7 For the payment of costs in suits against delinquent  
8 dealers for mercantile and other licenses incurred during  
9 the years one thousand nine hundred and nineteen and  
10 one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one the sum of ten  
11 thousand dollars (\$10,000) or so much thereof as may be  
12 necessary

13 For the balance due or to become due retired county  
14 officers on account of over-payment of mercantile and other  
15 taxes collected for the Commonwealth the sum of five  
16 thousand dollars (\$5,000)

17 For the payment of postage express charges cost of  
18 filing liens and contingent expenses two years the sum of  
19 thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000)

20 DEPARTMENT OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS

21 For the payment of the salary of the Secretary of  
22 Internal Affairs two years the sum of sixteen thousand  
23 dollars (\$16,000)

24 For the payment of the salary of the Deputy Sec-  
25 retary of Internal Affairs two years the sum of six  
26 thousand dollars (\$6,000)

27 For the payment of the salary of the clerk to the  
28 Board of Public Property two years the sum of four  
29 hundred dollars (\$400)

1 For the payment of the salary of the Chief of the  
2 Bureau of Standards in the Department of Internal Affairs  
3 two years the sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000).

4 For the payment of traveling and other contingent  
5 expenses for the Bureau of Standards for the two fiscal  
6 years beginning June first one thousand nine hundred and  
7 seventeen the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and  
8 for additional equipment and maintenance the sum of five  
9 hundred dollars (\$500)

10 For the payment of the salaries of the other offi-  
11 cials clerks and employes in the Department of Internal  
12 Affairs two years the sum of seventy-seven thousand two  
13 hundred dollars (\$77,200)

14 For the payment of contingent expenses two years the  
15 sum of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000)

16 For the payment of services rendered and expenses in-  
17 curred in the collection of tax statistics and for the  
18 compilation of the same as required by the act of As-  
19 sembly approved May ninth one thousand eight hundred  
20 and eighty-nine for the two fiscal years beginning June  
21 first one thousand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of  
22 ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to be paid upon the war-  
23 rant of the Auditor General upon specifically itemized  
24 vouchers certified by the Secretary of Internal Affairs

25 For the payment of necessary services and expenses in-  
26 curred through the bureau of railways of the Department  
27 of Internal Affairs in the investigation of complaints made  
28 against corporations under sections four and five of the  
29 act approved the eleventh day of May one thousand eight

1 hundred and seventy-four for the necessary services and  
2 expenses incident to the investigation against delinquent cor-  
3 porations under the act approved the nineteenth day of  
4 April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven and for  
5 the investigation of accidents and the securing of special  
6 reports as authorized under section eleven article seventeen  
7 of the Constitution and for the payment of postage ex-  
8 press charges and other incidental expenses of the bureau  
9 for the two fiscal years beginning June first one thou-  
10 sand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of five thou-  
11 sand dollars (\$5,000) All expenditures under this appro-  
12 priation to be itemized on vouchers by the Secretary of  
13 Internal Affairs and filed with the Auditor General

14 For the payment of skilled draftsmen surveyors and  
15 other assistants necessary to the proper continuation of the  
16 warrantee map work authorized by the act of Assembly  
17 approved June thirteenth one thousand nine hundred and  
18 seven and subsequent amendments and supplements thereto  
19 including all necessary traveling and subsistence expenses in  
20 the field work of the same for the two fiscal years be-  
21 ginning June first one thousand nine hundred and nine-  
22 teen the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000)

23 For services and other expenses incident to the investi-  
24 gating and surveying of vacant and unappropriated land  
25 as authorized and provided in the first section of the  
26 act entitled "An act relating to the granting of titles by  
27 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to vacant and unappropri-  
28 ated land the price to be paid for the same the con-

1 veyance to the State Forestry Reservation Commission where  
2 desirable for forest culture or forest preservation prevent-  
3 ing the granting of warrants for the beds of navigable  
4 rivers and providing for acceptance of returns of surveys  
5 without limitation as to excess or surplus" approved the  
6 third day of May one thousand nine hundred and nine  
7 for the two fiscal years beginning June first one thou-  
8 sand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of one thou-  
9 sand five hundred dollars (\$1,500)

10 For the payment of expenses incident to maintenance  
11 of equipment and for additional equipment for the two  
12 fiscal years beginning June first one thousand nine hun-  
13 dred and nineteen the sum of three hundred dollars  
14 (\$300.00)

15 For the temporary employment of draftsmen in copy-  
16 ing the surveys or other ancient papers important to be  
17 preserved in the land office bureau as required by the  
18 act approved the sixteenth day of February one thousand  
19 eight hundred and thirty-three (Pamphlet Laws page forty-  
20 seven) for the two fiscal years beginning June first one  
21 thousand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of thirty-two  
22 thousand dollars (\$32,000)

23 For the inspection and repairs of State boundary-line  
24 monuments under authority of section two of the act of  
25 Assembly approved May fourth one thousand eight hundred  
26 and eighty-nine and subsequent amendments and supplements  
27 thereto for the two fiscal years beginning June first one  
28 thousand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of one thou-  
29 sand dollars (\$1,000)

25 years the sum of ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) or so  
26 much thereof as may be necessary

27       For the purchase of patent indices law books and other  
28 books necessary for the proper conduct of the work of  
29 the department two years the sum of one thousand five

1 hundred dollars (\$1,500) or so much thereof as may be  
2 necessary

3 For the payment of traveling expenses of the State  
4 Treasurer and employes while on departmental business two  
5 years the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or so much

5 exceed one hundred dollars per month for five months of

19 examining boards for State permanent and special certifi-  
20 cates two years the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000)

21 For the payment of four stenographers and typewriters  
22 two years the sum of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000)

23 For the payment of the cost of circulating the Penn-  
24 sylvania School Journal two years the sum of five thou-  
25 sand dollars (\$5,000)

26 Bureau of Professional Education

27 For the payment of the officers and assistants and  
28 expenses of the Bureau of Professional Education in the

1 Department of Public Instruction two years the sum of  
2 twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000)

3 Bureau of Medical Education and Licensure

4 For the payment of the salaries and expenses of the  
5 officers and members of the Bureau of Medical Education  
6 and Licensure and for incidental expenses including rent  
7 clerical services stenographer typewriting and other necessary  
8 assistance two years the sum of thirty thousand dollars  
9 (\$30,000)

10 For the payment of the expenses incurred in the  
11 regulation of the practice of midwifery act of June fifth  
12 one thousand nine hundred and thirteen (Pamphlet Laws  
13 four hundred and forty-one) the sum of fifteen thousand  
14 five hundred dollars (\$15,500)

15 State Board of Education

16 For the payment of the necessary expenses of the  
17 members of the State Board of Education and the salar-  
18 ies of clerks stenographers and other employes and of  
19 other necessary expenses of the board two years the sum  
20 of fifty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$57,500)

21 Schools

22 For the support of the public schools State normal  
23 schools vocational schools continuation schools and other  
24 public school agencies in this Commonwealth for the two  
25 fiscal years beginning on the first Monday of July one  
26 thousand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of twenty  
27 million dollars (\$20,000,000)

28 Provided That out of said amount hereby appropriated  
29 there shall be set apart the sum of nine hundred thou-

1 sand dollars (\$900,000) for the encouragement and support  
2 of township and borough high schools including joint high  
3 schools maintained by two or more townships or by a  
4 borough and one or more townships but no high school  
5 shall receive appropriations as a high school of the first  
6 grade unless it has three teachers who devote their en-  
7 tire time to the high school work during a period of  
8 nine months and no high schools shall receive appropria-  
9 tions as a high school of the second grade unless it has  
10 two teachers who devote their entire time to high school  
11 work during a period of eight months nor shall any  
12 high school receive appropriation unless it has a regular  
13 attendance of twelve pupils doing high school work

14 And provided further That out of the amount hereby  
15 appropriated there shall be paid for the education of  
16 teachers in the State normal schools the sum of eight  
17 hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$850,000) to be ap-  
18 plied as follows For each student over seventeen years of  
19 age who shall sign an agreement binding said student  
20 to teach in the common schools of this State two full  
21 annual terms there shall be paid the sum of one dol-  
22 lar and fifty cents a week towards the payment of ex-  
23 penses for tuition for said student Provided That each  
24 student in a State normal school drawing such an allow-  
25 ance from the State must receive regular instruction in  
26 the science and art of teaching in a special class de-  
27 voted to that object for the whole time for which said

1 allowance is drawn which amount shall be paid upon the  
2 warrant of the Superintendent of Public Instruction

3 And provided further That out of the said amount  
4 hereby appropriated there shall be set apart the sum of  
5 two hundred and ninety-five thousand dollars (\$295,000) to  
6 be expended on the warrants of the Superintendent of  
7 Public Instruction for the payment of the salaries of the  
8 county superintendents of public schools for two years

9 And provided further That out of the said amount  
10 hereby appropriated there shall be set apart the sum of  
11 two hundred and thirty-one thousand dollars (\$231,000) to  
12 be expended on the warrant of the Superintendent of  
13 Public Instruction for the payments of the salaries for  
14 two years of the assistant county superintendents of public  
15 schools

16 And provided further That the sum of five hundred  
17 and twenty thousand dollars (\$520,000) or so much thereof  
18 as may be necessary is hereby set apart out of said  
19 amount for the several normal schools organized and ac-  
20 cepted as such under the laws of this Commonwealth to  
21 be divided equally among them for the two fiscal years  
22 beginning June first one thousand nine hundred and nine-  
23 teen for maintenance for the payment of debts already in-  
24 curred and for betterments

25 And provided further That the sum of two hundred  
26 and fifty-four thousand dollars (\$254,000) is hereby set  
27 apart out of said amount for necessary additions exten-  
28 sions alterations equipment and repairs to the several nor-  
29 mal schools now owned by the Commonwealth

1 And provided further That out of said amount the  
2 sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or so  
3 much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated  
4 to the State Board of Education for the purchase by  
5 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania of State normal schools  
6 in this Commonwealth and for liquidation of indebtedness

4 Section 22 For the payment of expenses incident to  
5 the participation in the proceedings of the organiaztion  
6 known as the Governor's Conference for the years one  
7 thousand nine hundred and nineteen and one thousand nine  
8 hundred and twenty the sum of three hundred dol-  
9 lars (\$300)

10 Section 23 For the payment of the expenses for the  
11 publication in the various newspapers of the State the  
12 several amendments to the Constitution of the Common-  
13 wealth for the two fiscal years beginning June first one  
14 thousand nine hundred and nineteen the sum of one hun-  
15 dred and twenty thousand dollars or so much thereof as  
16 may be necessary (\$120,000) Provided however That for the  
17 purpose of facilitating the settlement of the accounts with  
18 publishers of newspapers in which are published Constitu-  
19 tional amendments and which are to be paid from the  
20 appropriations herein made the Secretary of the Common-  
21 wealth shall prior to the letting of any such advertising  
22 obtain from the publishers of all newspapers of general  
23 circulation who may desire to secure publication of the  
24 Constitutional amendments sworn statements of their aver-
