AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10 1949 (P L 30) entitled "An act relating to the public school system including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto" providing for attendance of day students in vocational education at Thaddeus Stevens Trade School and for payment of tuition to the school by the district of residence of such students

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 The act of March 10 1949 (P L. 30) known as the "Public
2 School Code of 1949" is amended by adding after section 1809 a new
3 section to read

4 Section 1809.1 Attendance of Day Students at Thaddeus Stevens
5 Trade School The board of school directors of any school district
6 which does not maintain an approved vocational education department
7 or does not maintain such a department or school offering the type of
8 training a pupil desires may permit any pupil to attend Thaddeus
9 Stevens Trade School as a day student subject to such terms and con-
10 ditions as the Board of Trustees of Thaddeus Stevens Trade School may
11 determine The school district in which any such pupil resides shall pay
12 to the Thaddeus Stevens Trade School the high school tuition charge
13 provided for by this act in the same manner as payments are made for
14 pupils attending vocational education departments or schools in other
15 school districts
