## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 1 1959 (P L 392) entitled "An act relating to the retirement of State employes amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto" providing for the transfer of credits for employes of the Department of Health who are contributors to the Public School Employes' Retirement System

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 The first paragraph of section 702 act of June 1 1959  
2 (P L 392) known as the "State Employes' Retirement Code of 1959"  
3 amended August 4 1959 (P L 621) is amended to read

4 Section 702 Transfer of Credits from the Public School Employes'  
5 Retirement System to the State Employes' Retirement System Any  
6 contributor or employe of the Department of Public Health who is a  
7 contributor to the Public School Employes' Retirement System who  
8 as an employe under the public school system of the Commonwealth  
9 or the Department of Health made contributions and on account of  
10 whose service contributions were made by the State and by any school  
11 district to the Public School Employes' Retirement Fund on account  
12 of the service credited to him under the Public School Employes' Re-  
13 tirement System and for which he has not been credited under the  
14 State Employes' Retirement System may request the retirement board to  
15 give him credit for such previous service The retirement board shall  
16 credit the contributor with such period of service upon the fulfillment  
17 of the following conditions
