AN ACT

Amending the act of April 18 1929 (P L 612) entitled "An act for the election of the president members of town council and auditors in incorporated towns of the Commonwealth regulating the manner of voting for such officers and repealing inconsistent general local and special laws" redesignating the president of the town council as the mayor

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 The title and sections 1 and 4 act of April 18 1929 (P L
2 612) entitled "An act for the election of the president members of
3 town council and auditors in incorporated towns of the Commonwealth
4 regulating the manner of voting for such officers and repealing incon-
5 sistent general local and special laws" are amended to read

6 An Act

7 For the election of the [president] mayor members of town council and
8 auditors in incorporated towns of the Commonwealth regulating
9 the manner of voting for such officers and repealing inconsistent
10 general local and special laws

11 Section 1 Be it enacted &c That the town council of all incor-
12 porated towns of this Commonwealth shall consist of six councilmen
13 and a [president of the town council] mayor WHO SHALL BE PRES-
14 IDENT OF THE TOWN COUNCIL At the municipal election
15 in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine six councilmen
16 shall be elected at large by the voters in each such town three for terms
17 of two years each and three for terms of four years each Biennially
18 thereafter at each municipal election three councilmen shall be elected
19 for terms of four years each At the municipal election in the year one
20 thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine and every four years thereafter

1 a [president of the town council] mayor shall be elected by the voters
2 for a term of four years The term of the councilmen and [president of
3 the town council] mayor shall commence on the first Monday of January
4 succeeding their election Vacancies in the office of town council and
5 [president of the town council] mayor shall be filled in the manner now
6 provided by law

7 Section 4 The councilmen [president of the town council] and the
8 auditors shall have and possess such powers and perform such duties as
9 are now by law vested in and conferred upon such officers by the laws
10 of the Commonwealth The mayor shall have and possess such powers
11 and perform such duties as are now by law vested in and conferred upon
12 the president of the town council by the laws of the Commonwealth

13 Section 2 Whenever in any law the term "president of the town
14 council" is used it shall be deemed to mean mayor of a town
