CHAPTER III.

An ACT altering the manner of electing a Treafurer of the corporation of the city of Philadelphia.

Section 1. DE it enacted by the Senate and D House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the fourth Repeal of part section of an act of assembly, passed on the of sormer law, eleventh day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, entitled "An Act to " fupply certain defects in the acts incorpor-" ating the city of Philadelphia and fundry "towns and boroughs within this common-"wealth, and to explain and amend an act, " entitled " An Act to alter and amend the 66 feveral acts of the general affembly of this commonwealth, incorporating the city of " Philadelphia, and for other purposes;" provides that the treasurer of the corporation of the city of Philadelphia shall be appointed as heretofore, be, and the fame is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That from and after the paf-Treasurer to be fing of this act, the treasurer of the faid corjoint vote. poration shall be appointed annually by the joint votes of the members of the select and common councils of the said city, in the same manner as the constitution of this commonwealth prescribes for the appointment of the

state-treasurer, and not otherwise, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER IV.

An ACT for the establishment of a College at Canonsburg, in the county of Washington, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS, the establishment of a college at Canonsburg, in the county of Washington, for the instruction of youth in the learned languages, in the arts and sciences, and in useful literature, would tend to disfuse information and promote the public good: Therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That there be erected, and hereby is erected and established in Canonsburgh, in the county of Washington, in this Commonwealth, a college
