Sec. 4. *And be it further enacted by the au-
thority aforesaid,* That this act shall continue
in force for the term of three years, and from
thence to the end of the next sitting of the ge-
neral assembly, and no longer.

CHAPTER XXXV.

*An ACT altering the place of holding elections

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and
House of Representatives of the

CHAPTER XXXVI.
