## CHAPTER LIII.

An ACT to enable General John Steele and William Calhoun, to fell and convey a certain traff of land therein mentioned.

Section 1. DE it enacted by the Senate and D House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennfylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That general John Steele & Wm. Caland William Calhoun, or either of them, be, houn empowand they are hereby authorifed to fell and con-cred to fell and vey, on fuch terms, for fuch confideration, and of land in Druto fuch person or persons as they shall deem pro-more township per, just and right, and most beneficial to the ty, for the use inhabitants of Drumore township, in the coun-of faid townty of Lancaster, all that certain tract or parcel of land, fituate in the township aforesaid, containing about one hundred acres, more or less, and which was conveyed by Bryan Quin, by deed, dated twenty-fixth December, one thoufand feven hundred and fixty-feven, to Robert Long and Samuel McConnel, then overfeers of the poor of faid township, and their succesfors in office forever, after the death of faid Bryan Quin; and the monies arising from the fale thereof, shall be applied towards reimburfing the faid township for the expence necessarily incurred by them in supporting the faid Bryan Quin and his children.
