



within the limits heretofore prescribed by law for each of the said counties respectively.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the aforesaid commissioners shall have power, and it shall be their duty, to receive such proposals of land or money as may be made to them for the purpose of defraying the expence of erecting the public buildings in and for each of the said counties, and to take assurance of the same, for the benefit of the counties for whose use they are respectively made; for which services each of the said commissioners shall have and receive three dollars per diem, for every day they shall be necessarily employed in the said service, to be paid by warrants drawn by the commissioners of Allegheny county, on the treasurer of the said county; and the said commissioners of Allegheny county, are hereby authorized to demand and receive a due proportion of the said money from the county treasurers of Westmoreland and Crawford counties.

The commissioners empowered to receive such proposals of land or money as may be offered for defraying the expences of erecting the public buildings, &c.
