CHAPTER XCIV.

An ACT to re-annex part of Franklin township, in the county of Westmoreland, to the fifth election district in said county.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all that part of Franklin township, in the county of Westmoreland, that lies north of the New-Frankstown road, be and it is hereby re-annexed to the fifth election district in said county; and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the court-house in the borough of Greensburgh, any thing in any former law or laws to the contrary notwithstanding.

Part of Franklin township in Westmoreland county, re-annexed to the fifth election district & elections to be held at the court-house in Greensburgh.
