drawing off thereby so much of the water out of the said creek, as may be necessary for his mill and other water-works: *Provided*, He or they shall make a good and sufficient lock, for the free passage of boats, and keep the same in good order and repair, and such slope as may admit the passage of fish without interruption over the said dam, and also that the rights of all and every individual shall not be injured or infringed, by any of the privileges granted by this act.

An ACT for settling the aecounts of the trustees of Wayne county, and vesting the powers of said trustees in the county commissioners.

PE it enacted by the Senate and Section 1. House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners The commissioners of Wayne coun. of Wayne county, shall on or before the first ty to settle the day of June next, settle and adjust the accounts accounts of the trustees of of the trustees of said county, and pay out of the county stock, such sum or sums of money, said county as they may find due to the said trustees, or either
