Sec. 21. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all waggoners and drivers of carriages of all kinds, whether of burden or pleasure using the said road, shall except when passing by a carriage of slower draught, keep their horses and carriages on the right hand side of the said road, in the passing direction, leaving the other side of the road free and clear for other carriages to pass and repass, and if any driver shall offend against this provision, he shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding two dollars, to any person who shall be obstructed in his passage and will sue for the same, to be recovered with costs before any justice, in the same manner as debts under forty shillings are by law recovered.
