

Sec. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the citizens of that part of the fifth election district in the county of Lancaster, beginning at Miller's tavern and extending along a public road to Cocalico creek near Ephrata mill, and from thence down the said creek to the line of Earl township, shall be annexed to the ninth election district, and hold their elections at the house now occupied by Jacob Stahley, in Reamstown, in the township of Cocalico, any thing to the contrary thereof in any former law notwithstanding.

CHAPTER CLXX.

An ACT authorising the Judges of the court of common pleas of Northampton county, to hold two additional courts annually, in the said county.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the judges of the courts of common pleas in the county of Northampton, shall be authorised and required, to hold two additional courts of com-
