CHAPTER CLXXXIV.

An ACT declaring the Shenango or Pymatuning creek, a public stream or highway.

House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the Shenango creek declared passing of this act, the Shenango or Pyma- a public hightuning creek, a branch of Beaver creek, from way: the mouth of the same, up to its source be, and the same is hereby declared a public stream or highway, for the passage of rafts, boats or other vessels, and it shall and may be lawful for the inhabitants and others, desirous of using the navigation of the said creek, to remove all the natural obstructions in the said creek: Provided, That any person Previso as to or persons, owning or possessing land on said the erecting of mill-dams. creek, shall have liberty to erect any dam or dams, across the same, agreeably and subject to. all the restrictions and provisions of an act, of the general assembly of this commonwealth, passed the twenty third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and three, entitled "An act to authorize any person or persons "owning lands adjoining navigable streams of "water, declared public highways, to erect "dams upon such streams for mills and other. " water-works."
