

city of Philadelphia, the township of the Northern Liberties and the district of Southwark aforesaid, and the constables of the city, township and district aforesaid, shall perform the like services, and be entitled to the like compensations, as the constables of any township within this state are entitled to, for services rendered agreeably to the requisitions of this act, and the mayor, aldermen and alderman's court of the city of Philadelphia, and the justices of the peace of the township of the Northern Liberties and district of Southwark, shall annually at the settlement of the accounts of the guardians of the poor of said city, township and district, by the auditors appointed for the purpose, exhibit their respective dockets, if required, for the inspection of the said auditors for settlement.

CHAPTER CLXXXVI.

An ACT to authorise Deputy Surveyors or Assistants to administer oaths to Chain Carriers.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General assembly

sembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall be lawful for deputy surveyors or their regularly authorised assistants, to administer an oath or affirmation, to the persons employed as chain carriers, obliging each of them to the faithful performance, of the duty of chain carriers.

CHAPTER CLXXXVII.

An ACT to alter and amend the act, entitled
“An act to regulate the General Elections
“within* this Commonwealth.”

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That any judge of the court of common pleas, alderman or justice of the peace, who may be present at the election, shall administer the oaths or affirmations directed by the act, passed the fifteenth of February, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, entitled “An act to regulate the general elections of this state,” to be taken by the judges, inspectors and clerks of the election, by whom to be sworn.
