

CHAPTER XXI.

An ACT to continue in force for a limited time, the Act, entitled "An Act, for instituting a Board of Property, and for other purposes therein mentioned."

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Act, entitled "An Act, for instituting a Board of Property, and for other purposes therein mentioned," and every matter and thing therein contained, (the limitation clause only excepted,) shall be, and the same are hereby continued in force for seven years, from and after the passing of this act, and from thence to the end of the next Session of the General Assembly.

The principal act continued for 7 years.

The Board of Property, or any member thereof, empowered to administer oaths.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in addition to the powers heretofore vested in the Board of Property, said Board, or any member thereof, is hereby authorized to administer oaths, or affirmations to witnesses,

witnesſes, and others, in all caſes that may be neceſſary to the diſcharge of the duties of the Board.

CHAPTER XXII.

An ACT to raiſe by way of Lottery, a ſum not exceeding eight thouſand Dollars, for the uſe and benefit of the Miniſter, Wardens and Veſtry, of the African Episcopical Church, of St Thomas, in the city of Philadelphia.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and Houſe of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Aſſembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the ſame, That John Inſkeep, William Poyntell, Samuel Wheeler, John C. Stocker, Thomas Cumpſton, Robert M'Mullen and William Richards be, and are hereby appointed Commissioners appointed, &c, commissioners, to raiſe by way of lottery, a ſum of money, not exceeding eight thouſand dollars, for the purpoſes of diſcharging the debts of the miniſter.
