CHAPTER CIII.

An ACT to raise by way of lottery, a sum of money to defray the expence of finishing a church in the town of Anville in the County of Dauphin.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That, Anthony Carmony, Henry Berry, David Marshall, Daniel Henning, Abraham Raiguel, and John Shertzer, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to raise by way of lottery a sum of money not exceeding sixteen hundred dollars, to be by them applied for defraying the expence of finishing and completing a house of worship, already raised for the use of the Lutheran and Presbyterian congregations in the town of Anville, in the county of Dauphin.

Commissioners appointed.

Sum to be raised, and to what object applied.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the commissioners before they*

Duties to be performed by the commissioners previous to selling the tickets.

Before entering on their duties, to take an oath or affirmation, &c.

Further duties of the commissioners.

they proceed to sell any tickets in the lottery aforesaid, shall lay such scheme thereof before the Governor, as shall meet his approbation; and enter into bonds to him for the due performance of their duty, in drawing the same; and each of them, before entering on the duties of his appointment, shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, diligently and faithfully to perform the duties entrusted to him, and three or more of the said commissioners shall attend at the drawing of each day; and when the whole drawing shall be completed they shall cause an accurate list of the fortunate numbers to be published at least three times in one of the English and German newspapers, printed in the borough of Harrisburgh; and shall pay and discharge all the prizes that shall be demanded, by persons legally entitled thereto, within thirty days after the drawing shall be finished.

What prizes shall be considered as relinquished for the benefit of the scheme.

Sec. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all prizes not demanded within twelve months after the time mentioned for payment in the publications as aforesaid shall be considered and deemed as relinquished for the benefit of said church.
