

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*

Notice to be given of the time and place of meeting to organize the company.

Majority to choose a president, twelve managers, treasurer and other officers. Empowered to make by-laws.

To have the like powers, privileges, &c. as the Susquehanna and York-town turnpike compy. Work to be commenced within three, and completed within seven years, or the charter to be forfeited.

That the commissioners aforesaid as soon as conveniently may be after the said letters patent shall be sealed and obtained, shall give notice in three of the public newspapers, one in the town of Hanover, one in the borough of Carlisle, and one in Gettysburg and the borough of York, of a time and place by them to be appointed, not less than twenty days from the publication of the first notice, at which time and place the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose by a majority of votes of the said subscribers by ballot, to be delivered in person or by proxy duly authorized, one president and twelve managers, one treasurer and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year, and until such other officers shall be chosen, and shall and may make such by-laws, rules, orders and regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this commonwealth, as shall be necessary for the well-ordering the affairs of the said company, and shall have power to survey, lay down, ascertain, mark and fix such route as they shall deem expedient, beginning at the town of Hanover and ending at the borough of Carlisle, and generally have like powers, authorities and privileges necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, and be entitled to like tolls and profits in proportion to the distance, as are given and granted to the president, managers and company of the Susquehanna and York borough turnpike road : *Provided*, That if the company shall not proceed to carry on the said work in three years after the passing of this act, or shall not within seven years afterwards complete the said road according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises hereby granted to the said company shall revert to this commonwealth.

CHAPTER LIII.

A SUPPLEMENT to an Act, entitled "An Act supplementary to an act to raise by way of Lottery, a sum not exceeding eight thousand dollars, for the use and benefit of the minister, wardens and vestry of the African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas, in the city of Philadelphia.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature by the minister, wardens, and vestry of the Church of St. Thomas, in the city of Philadelphia, that the commissioners heretofore appointed have drawn a class of the said lottery, but owing to difficulties in the sale of the tickets, as well as other unforeseen events, they have only been able to raise the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, which sum is totally inadequate to relieve them from the debt which they have incurred in the finishing of their church. And whereas it has been represented that Samuel Wheeler, Thomas Cumpston, William Murdock, Peter Brown, Daniel Smith, Joseph B. Eves, and Ephraim Clark, the present commissioners, have declined proceeding further in the said lottery, for remedy whereof,

SECTION I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Joseph Worrell, Henry Orth, John Cuthbert, Matthew Daniel Shaw, Bartholomew Greaves, George Bartram, and Matthew Smith and others appointed commissioners to carry into effect the act of 6th February, 1804. Weaver be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners in the room of the said Thomas Cumpston, William Murdock, Peter Brown, Daniel Smith, Joseph B. Eves, and Ephraim Clark, and the said commissioners be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to carry the said act into execution, subject to the qualifications and restrictions contained in the original act passed on the sixth day of February, 1804; and in case of death or resignation of any or either of the said commissioners, a majority surviving are hereby authorized and empowered to raise the sum of five thousand five hundred dollars, being the sum deficient, as contemplated by the original act.
