Time for site, &c. for the poor house in Cumberland county, extended.

SECT. I. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General purchasing a Assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the time specified by law for the five citizens to purchase a site and piece of ground, whereon to erect a house for the employment and support of the poor in the county of Cumberland, be extended to the first day of December next.
