hereby authorized to lend to the government of the United States, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of five hundred thousand dollars, at any time after the passing of this act, and the stock, rights or evidences of said debt, to sell and dispose of whenever the said president, directors and company shall deem such sale necessary or useful.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the stock of the said corporation shall not be assignable or transferable to any person except citizens of the United States, from and after the fourth day of March next.

SECT. V. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if any note or bill drawn or accepted, payable and discounted at any office of discount and deposit, which now is or may hereafter be established by the said corporation, shall be sent to be protested for non-payment, the notary public, or other proper officer, shall leave notice thereof at the office of discount and deposit aforesaid, at which such note or bill has been made payable, and such notice shall be considered the legal notice of protest, any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

## CHAPTER XXVII.

*An ACT to perfect the title of Thomas Harrison, Philip Jones and Robert C. Martin, to a lot of ground in the county of Philadelphia.*

SECTION I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the deed of conveyance made and executed to Thomas Harrison, Philip Jones, and Robert C. Martin, of the city of Philadelphia, by John Encell, dated the thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight, recorded at Philadelphia in deed book E F, No 32, page 248, &c. whereby the said John Encell conveys to the said Thomas Harrison, Philip Jones and Robert C. Martin, as tenants in common, all his estate, title and interest in a lot of ground in the township of Passyunk, in the county of Philadelphia, beginning at the intersection of Cedar or South-street, and a street called Water-street, containing in front on said Water-street, one hundred feet, and extending in depth the same di-

mensions into the river Schuylkill to low-water-mark, be, and the same is hereby declared to be as valid in law, to all intents and purposes as if the said John Encell had been a citizen of the United States at the time of his purchase, and of executing the deed of conveyance aforesaid: *Provided always*, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to bar or defeat, any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate, of any right, title, interest, claim or demand, which they may have, in or to the said lot or piece of land, or any part or parcel thereof. Proviso.

CHAPTER XXVIII.

An ACT to authorize the administrators of William Rodgers, deceased, to convey a certain tract or parcel of land to the purchaser.

WHEREAS it appears that William Rodgers of the county of Green, deceased, was seized in his life-time of a certain tract or parcel of land in Morris township and county of Green aforesaid, which he in his lifetime did sell and engage to convey to John M'Gumphey of said county, but of which sale there is no written evidence to enable the administrators of the deceased to make and execute a deed to the said purchaser, consistent with the laws of this commonwealth: Therefore,

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Gertra Rodgers administratrix, and Joseph Masters administrator of William Rodgers, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered by sufficient deed, to convey to John M'Gumphey, his heirs and assigns, in fee simple, agreeably to the sale made by William Rodgers in his lifetime, a certain tract or parcel of land containing fifty acres, and allowance, lying and being in Morris township, in the county of Green, adjoining lands of Elias Conger. Administrators of Wm. Rodgers, deceased, enabled to convey certain lands to John M'Gumphey.
