

CHAPTER XC.

An ACT for the relief of Richard Bache and others:

SECTION I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

That the accounting officers, be, and they are hereby directed to liquidate and settle agreeably to the provisions of the second section of the act entitled "An act making appropriations for the expenses of Government and payment of certain debts, and for other purposes:" passed the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and five; the value of a certificate of the funded debt of Pennsylvania, number twelve thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, issued to his late excellency, Dr. Benjamin Franklin, deceased, for the sum of fourteen pounds, seven shillings and five pence specie, and the sum found due thereon, shall be paid to Richard Bache, administrator with the will annexed of the said Doctor Benjamin Franklin, deceased, on a warrant to be drawn by the auditor general on the state-treasurer, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Amount of certificate No. 12883 to be paid to Richard Bache.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*

That the accounting officers, be, and they are hereby directed to liquidate and settle agreeably to the provisions of tenth section of the act entitled an "Act making certain appropriations, and to enable the governor of the commonwealth, to negotiate certain loans, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" passed the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and three, the value of a new loan certificate of Pennsylvania, number eleven thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, issued to Christian Yorty for sixteen pounds, and the sum due thereon, shall be paid to the said Christian Yorty, by a warrant to be drawn by the auditor-general, on the state-treasurer, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

And of new loan certificate No. 11849 to Christian Yorty.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*

That the accounting officers, be, and they are hereby directed to liquidate and settle agreeably to the provisions of the second section of the act entitled "An act making appropriations for the expenses of government and payment of certain debts, and for other purposes;" passed the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and five; the value of a certificate of the funded debt of Pennsylvania, number 14097, issued to John Linn, for the sum of two pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence, specie, and the sum so found due thereon, shall be paid to William Linn of Franklin county the present possessor of said certificate on a warrant drawn by the auditor general on the State treasurer, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

And of the funded debt certificate, No. 14097 to W. Linn.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*

That the accounting officers, be, and they are hereby directed to liquidate and settle, agreeably to the provisions of the tenth section of the act entitled "An act making certain appropriations, and to enable the governor of this commonwealth to negotiate certain loans, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" passed the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and three, the value of a new loan certificate, number six thousand four hundred and twenty-seven, issued to Andrew McIlvain or bearer, for one pound seventeen shillings and six-pence, and the sum so found due thereon shall be paid to John Dixon of Adams county, the present possessor of said certificate by a warrant drawn by the auditor general, on the state treasurer, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

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CHAPTER XCI.

An ACT to enable the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Sunbury, in the county of Northumberland, to Aaronsburgh, in Centre county, passing through Northumberland, Derrstown and Youngmanstown.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*
That Simon Gratz, Henry Pratt, Daniel W. Coxe, George Sheaff, Samuel Wetherill, junior, and John Baker of the city of Philadelphia; John Adams, and Lewis Rees of Reading; Charles Hall, Andrew Albright, and Thomas Grant of the borough of Sunbury; John Philip Degruchy, and Jacob Dentler, of or near Northumberland; Christopher Baldy, and Andrew Billmeyer of Derrstown; Jacob Probst, Thomas Youngman, of or near Youngmanstown; James Duncan, Michael Bollinger, William Ranken, and John Dunlap of Centre county, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several things hereinafter mentioned: *that is to say,* They shall, on or before the first Monday of May next, procure three books, and in each of them enter as follows: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the President, Managers and Company of the Buffaloe and Pennsvalley Turnpike Road, leading from Sunbury to Aaronsburgh, the sum of fifty dollars for every share of stock in the said company, set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such
