CHAPTER CXX.

An Act establishing an academy in Carmichael's town, in the county of Greene.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority*

An academy established in Carmichael's town.

Style and title of Commissioners named. Who and their successors shall be a body politic.

Powers and duties of. Style of the corporation.

of the same, That there shall be, and hereby is established, in Carmichael's town, in the county of Greene, an academy or public school, for the education of youth in the English and other languages, in the useful arts, sciences and literature, by the name, style, and title of "Greene Academy," under the care, direction and government of six trustees, to wit: Charles Swan, James Fleniken, George Evans, Robert Lewis, Robert Whitehill junior and Hugh Barclay, which said trustees, and their successors, to be elected as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be, and hereby are declared to be one body politic and corporate in deed, and in law, by the name style and title of "The Trustees of Greene Academy," invested with similar powers and required to perform similar duties to those vested in, and directed to be performed by the trustees of Union academy in the county of Fayette, under the directions and provisions of the act entitled "An act establishing an Academy in the borough of Uniontown in the county of Fayette," passed February fourth, one thousand eight hundred and eight, except as is otherwise provided for by this act.

Number of trustees to be six. Their term of service.

4 of whom to be a quorum.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the number of trustees shall be six, as aforesaid, and shall be so changed as that none of them shall continue in office for a longer term than six years, without being re-elected by the people of the said county, and for that purpose it shall be the duty of the said trustees at their first meeting, when not less than four of them shall be present (which number of members shall be a board or quorum to do business) and they are hereby authorized and required to cast lots for ascertaining the member to be changed each year until the whole number shall be changed, and in order annually to supply the va-*

vacancy, as the same may take place, the citizens of the said county of Greene on the second Tuesday of October next, and annually thereafter forever at the same places, in the same manner and under the same laws, rules, and regulations as members of the state legislature shall be chosen, shall elect one trustee to supply the place of the trustee, so going out of office; *Provided*, That trustees so going out shall always be eligible to the office of trustee.

How the members shall be changed. Elections for to be held, &c. Proviso.

SECT. III: *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the first meeting of the said trustees shall be at Carmichael's town, on the third Tuesday of May next, and meetings of the said trustees shall be held annually at the same place thereafter forever, with power to adjourn from time to time, as may by them be found convenient and useful for the said institution.

Annual meetings to be held, &c.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the trustees shall appoint a treasurer annually, who shall receive and hold all monies belonging to the institution, and pay the same on orders signed by the board; he shall keep fair accounts thereof, to be open at all times to the inspection of the trustees, and before he enter upon the duties of his office give bond in any sum at their discretion, with two or more sufficient sureties conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties enjoined, and the repayment of all monies received by him which bond shall be deposited with the prothonotary of the county.

Treasurer to be appointed. Duties of.

Shall give bond, &c.

SECT. V. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the sum of two thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby granted out of any unappropriated money which shall be in the treasury of this commonwealth, to be paid to the treasurer of the institution, by the state treasurer, on the order or orders of the said trustees, or any four of them herein before mentioned, to be applied under their directions, one thousand dollars thereof in the erecting or repairing of buildings suitable for the accommodation of the institution, and the purchasing of books, mathematical instruments, and the necessary philosophical apparatus, and the remaining one thousand dollars to be placed in some safe fund, and the income thereof, for ever to be applied in compensating a teacher or teachers in the education of the children of the poor. And there shall be admitted into said Academy in consequence of the aforesaid grant, any number of poor children that may at any time be offered, in order to be taught gratis; *Provided*, The number so admitted and taught shall at no time be greater than six, and that none of the said children so admitted shall continue in said Academy, to be taught gratis, should others apply, longer than two years: *And Provided further*, That the aforesaid sum of two thousand dollars shall not be drawn from the State treasury, until the trustees or vestrymen of the Episcopalian Con-

gregation of Carmichaelstown aforesaid, or a majority of the survivors of them, or those to whom the same may belong, shall convey or make over in fee simple to the aforesaid institution or body politic, and incorporate the right and title which said congregation have, or are now vested with, to a certain church or stone building in Carmichaelstown aforesaid, erected by said society as a place for worship, together with the lot of ground on which the building stands, for the use and purpose of an Academy or Schoolhouse to be under the care and direction of said institution agreeably to their offer of Donation, on condition, that the State would endorse the same with a grant of money from the treasury.

Penalty on trustees not submitting their books, &c. to the auditors of Greene county.

SECT. VI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said trustees under the penalty of twenty dollars each, to be recovered as debts to that amount, are by law recoverable, one half for the use of the poor, who may be taught in the said institution, and the other half for the use of the person or persons who may sue for the same, shall annually exhibit all their books, accounts and vouchers of every kind, to the auditors of the said county of Greene, if the said auditors or any two of them shall require the same to be settled, adjusted, and published in the same manner as the accounts of the county commissioners are, or shall be by law directed to be settled, adjusted, and published.

CHAPTER CXXI.

An ACT to repeal parts of certain acts of Assembly therein mentioned, and to provide a mode of investing in stock the surplus money in the treasury and for other purposes.

Parts of certain acts repealed.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the following acts of Assembly, to wit: "An act to encourage the patenting lands and for other purposes," passed the fourth of April, one thousand eight hundred and five, the act entitled, "A supplement to an act entitled an act to enable the Governor of this commonwealth, to incorporate a company for opening a Canal and Lock navigation between the rivers Schuylkill and Susquehanna, by the waters of Tulpehoccon, Quittapahilla, and Swatara, in the counties of Berks and Dauphin," passed the fourth of March, one thousand eight hundred and seven, and
