CHAPTER CXXII.

An ACT to repeal certain acts therein mentioned.

 B^E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the following acts, to wit: The act entitled, "An act about boats and canoes;" The act entitled "An act for the appraisement of goods" The act entitled, "An act against wears cross creeks and rivers," The act entitled, "An act for ascertaining the dimensions of casks, and for the true packing of meat, for transportation," The act entitled, "The law against persons judging in their own cause," The act entitled, " An act for the destruction of black birds and crows," which said acts were passed in the year one thousand seven hundred. The act entitled: "An act for Mariners not to be trusted, passed in the year one thousand seven hundred and five," The act entitled, "An act about arrests and making debtors pay by servitude," passed in the same year, The act entitled, " An act for the well tanning and currying of leather, and regulating of Cordwainers, and other artificers using and occupying leather within this province," passed the twenty-sixth of August, in the year one thousand seven hundred and twenty-one, The act entitled, "An act for encouraging the making of good Beer, and for the consumption of grain in this province, passed the twelfth day of May, in the year one thousand seven hundred and twenty two, and the supplement to said act passed the thirtieth day of March, one thousand seven hundred and twenty three, and the act entitled, "An act to improve the breed of Horses, and regulate rangers, passed the ninth of May, in the year one thousand seven hundred and twenty-four, and the act entitled, "A supplement to an act entitled "An act to improve the breed of Horses, and regulate rangers," passed ninth December, one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine, and the act entitled, "A further supplement to the act entitled, " An act to improve the breed of Horses and regulate rangers," passed twenty-second April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, be, and the same hereby are repealed.
