

CHAPTER CXXIII.

A supplement to an act entitled, "An act to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Harrisburg through Lewistown and Huntingdon, to Pittsburg."

SECT. I. *BE* it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That for the purpose of making a turnpike road over the Allegheny Mountain, from the south east side in Huntingdon county, in the best direction from the borough of Huntingdon to Pittsburg, to the foot of Laurel-Hill, on the west, as an important part of the great road contemplated by the act to which this is a supplement, the following persons viz. John Brown, George McClelland, George Mulholland and James Criswell of Mifflin county, George Anshutz, Martin Rahm, Andrew Henderson, John Blair, Lazarus Lowry, David Stewart, Thomas Provines, Michael Wallace, Lewis Mytinger, William Moore, Patrick Guinn and Samuel Steel, of Huntingdon county, Philip Benner, John Dunlap, James Harris and Benjamin Patton of Centre county, James Maloy, James Elder, James C. Maguire and Samuel White, of Cambria county, Charles Campbell, Isaac Rogers, Conrad Lintoner, Edward Howard and Samuel Talmage, of Indiana county, Nicholas Day, Nicholas Chapman, James Kelly, Jeremiah Murray and William Johnston of Westmoreland county, Nathaniel Irish, James Martin, Anthony Beelen and James Gibson of Allegheny county, shall be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to do and perform the duties hereinafter mentioned, viz. They shall procure a certain number of books, and in each of them, enter as follows, "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay the President and Managers, of the Huntingdon, Cambria and Indiana turnpike road company, the sum of fifty dollars for every share by us subscribed for, in such manner and proportions, and at such times and places, as shall be determined on by the said president and managers, in pursuance of an act entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, "An act to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Harrisburg through Lewistown and Huntingdon, to Pittsburg." and shall give notice in at least, one public newspaper, printed in the city of Philadelphia, Huntingdon, Greensburg and Pittsburg, for one calendar month, of the time when the said books shall be opened, in the towns of Lewistown, Huntingdon, Bellefont, Ebensburg, Indianatown, New-Alexandria and Pittsburg, to receive subscriptions of stock, to the aforesaid company, at which respective times and places, some one or more

One or more of the commissioners to attend. How long to be kept open.

of the aforesaid commissioners, shall attend and receive subscriptions from all persons of lawful age, who shall offer to subscribe in the said book, which shall be kept open for the purpose aforesaid, at least six hours in every juridical day, for the space of six days, or until the book or books, shall have subscribed therein respectively as follows, *viz.* In Huntingdon, four hundred shares, in Bellefont, two hundred shares, in Lewistown, one hundred and fifty shares, in Ebensburg, one hundred shares, in the town of Indiana, one hundred shares, in New-Alexandria, one hundred and fifty shares, in Pittsburgh, two hundred shares, and if at the expiration of the said six days, the books aforesaid, or any of them, shall not have the respective number of shares as aforesaid, therein subscribed, the said commissioners respectively may adjourn from time to time, and transfer the said books from place to place, until the whole number of shares for the company aforesaid, shall be subscribed, of which adjournments and transfers the commissioners aforesaid, shall give public notice, as the occasion may require, and every person offering to subscribe in any of the aforesaid books, in his, or her own, or any other name, shall previously pay to the attending commissioner three dollars for every share to be subscribed, out of which, shall be defrayed the expences attending the taking such subscriptions, and all other incidental charges, and the residue shall be paid over to the treasurer of the corporation, as soon as the same shall be organized.

If said books have not the full number of shares subscribed therein within 6 days, they may be transferred. Notice of transferring the books to be given.

§3 to be paid on subscribing.

How appropriated.

When 50 persons or more, shall have subscribed, the one third of the whole number of shares required, the same to be certified to the governor. Who shall erect the subscribers into a body politic. Style and title of. And privileges.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That when fifty persons or more, shall have subscribed one third of the shares aforesaid, the commissioners may, or when the whole number of shares aforesaid, shall be subscribed, they shall certify under their hands and seals, the names of the subscribers, and the number of shares subscribed by each, to the Governor of this commonwealth, and when the one-third of the whole number of shares shall be subscribed, it shall, and may be lawful for the Governor by letters patent under his hand, and the seal of the State, to create and erect the subscribers into one body politic, and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The President, Managers and Company of the Huntingdon, Cambria and Indiana turnpike road," and by the said name, the said subscribers shall have succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation, and shall be capable of taking and holding their said capital stock, and the increase and profits thereof, and of enlarging the same, from time to time, by new subscriptions, in such manner and form as they shall think proper, if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent of this act, and of purchasing, taking and holding to them and their successors and assigns, and of selling, transferring and conveying in fee simple, or for any less estate,

all such lands, tenements, hereditaments and estate, real and personal, as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their work, and of suing and being sued, and of doing all and every other matter and thing which a corporation or body politic, may lawfully do, and generally have all the powers, authorities and privileges, and be subject to all the duties qualifications and restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures which are given and granted, or imposed upon the president, managers and company under the act to which this is a supplement.

And restriction.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That as soon as the company shall be incorporated, in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, and shall proceed to carry on the road contemplated to be completed by the said act, the said company to be incorporated by this act, shall be incorporated with and the subscribers thereto shall constitute a part of the company to be incorporated by virtue of the act to which this is a supplement, and shall cease to act or be known by any other name, character or capacity, and the said company so consolidated, shall have and enjoy all the privileges, rights and benefits, provided in and by the act to which this is a supplement. *Provided* nevertheless, that the tolls on so much of the said road as shall be completed under this act, shall continue to be divided if any dividend shall be declared to the original subscribers under this act, until a portion of the road equal to what shall have been made by the company under this act, shall be completed by the consolidated company, for which they shall be entitled to receive toll, and all unsettled accounts of the said company shall be settled and adjusted by the consolidated company, who shall be liable to all the engagements and contracts of the company which may be incorporated under this act, and nothing herein shall operate or be construed to impair or defeat any of the provisions of the original act. *And provided also,* until the said consolidation, the said company shall continue an entire separate body politic.

When the company in the original act mentioned, shall be incorporated &c. the corporation hereby created, to be incorporated therewith. Proviso as to the tolls.
