

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all

Transfers of property, belonging to the society for the relief of decayed pilots, &c. to be made by a majority of the managers.

transfers of the property, stock and estate of "The society for the relief of distressed and decayed pilots, their widows and children," shall be made and executed by a majority of the managers of the said society for the time being; and that all releases and acquittances of and for all sums of money which the treasurer of the said society for the time being shall receive on any mortgage, bond, bill, or other security, shall also be made and executed by a majority of the said managers and attested by the treasurer for the time being, and not otherwise. And where acknowledgment of satisfaction for such sums of money respectively ought to be made of record the managers making and executing the releases and acquittances therefor as aforesaid, shall empower the said treasurer in writing, under their hands and the common seal of the said society, to make such acknowledgment of record accordingly. And the said treasurer for the time being shall in pursuance of such power, (but not otherwise,) make and enter satisfaction of record within one month after request by the party, his heirs, executors, or administrators, under the penalty of forfeiting any sum of money not exceeding the sum paid, to be recovered by the party aggrieved, in any court of competent jurisdiction as other penalties are by law recoverable.

Releases, acquittances, mortgages, &c. to be executed by a majority of them.

May empower the Treasurer to record acknowledgments, &c.

Treasurer liable to a penalty for neglect, to be recovered as other penalties are by law recoverable.

Five managers to constitute a quorum.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That five managers of the said society for the time being shall be a competent number to enter upon, order and despatch all the business and affairs of the said society, any thing in the act to which this a supplement, to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding.

Parts of a former act repealed.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the said act to which this is a supplement as is hereby altered, amended and supplied, and no more, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER X.

An ACT granting an annuity to William Kernichon, for life.

WHEREAS it satisfactorily appears to the legislature, that William Kernichon was regularly discharged from the

first regiment of Pennsylvania, at the end of the revolutionary war, and that while in service he received a wound in his face, which appears to be incurable ; Therefore,

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of forty dollars be, and the same is hereby granted to William Kernichon to be paid to him or his order, immediately after the passing of this act, out of any monies in the treasury not otherwise appropriated ; and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted for the use of the said William Kernichon for life, to be paid to John Hough of Bucks county, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, to be expended in providing clothing and diet for the said William Kernichon, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eleven ; and it shall be the duty of the said John Hough, his executor, or executors, administrator or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Bucks county, on oath or affirmation, how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust to him or them confided by this act.

Donation of forty dollars to William Kernichon,

An annuity of forty dollars to be paid to John Hough, &c.

In what manner to be expended.

Annual report thereof to be made to the orphans court.

CHAPTER XI.

An ACT to incorporate the Governor's Creek Meadow Company.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Isaac Ivans, Aaron Ivans, Thomas Crozer, Moses Doan, John Comfort, Seth Wright, James Bussom, Thomas Hartley, Hector Calbraith, Benjamin Wright, and Lucy Mull, Lydia Mull, Mary Mull, Catharine Mull, and Margaret Mull, representatives of Martin Müll, deceased, and their successors, be, and they are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate in law and in fact, by the name, style and title of the "Governor's Creek Meadow Company," and by the name, style and title aforesaid, to have and enjoy all the usual and necessary powers of bodies politic and corporate.
