CHAPTER XVII.

An ACT enabling a committee appointed by the Supreme Court to sell and dispose of the real estate of Jacob Palmer, a lunatio.

WHEREAS it appears by the proceedings had in the supreme court of the state of Pennsylvania, that a certain Jacob Palmer, of the city of Philadelphia, has been adjudged a lunatic, and that John B. Palmer and Frederick Heisz were by the said court duly appointed a committee to take care of the person and estate of the said Jacob Palmer. And whereas the said committee have represented to the legislature that his real estate is in want of repairs, and consequently unproductive, that if repaired it would not rent for a sum sufficient to maintain the said lunatic, and repay the interest of the monies which must necessarily be borrowed to make the said repairs, and that it would be more for the interest of the said lunatic, and his heirs, that the said estate should be sold; Therefore,

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall John B. clothing, and make the purchaser such deed or deeds or other assurances as will assure and convey to the said purchaser or purchasers all the right, title and interest which the said lunatic hath in such real estate: Provided, That the said John B. Palmer and Frederick Heisz, shall, before they proceed to sell or convey the whole or any part of the estate of Jacob Palmer, enter into recognizance with sufficient security before the sudischarge of their preme court in the city of Philadelphia, where said estate lies, that all the money arising from the sales authorized by this act shall, after paying the debts, be disposed of by them as will be most for the interest of the said Jacob Palmer and his heirs.
