

authorized, one president and six managers, one treasurer and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year, and until such other officers shall be chosen, and the said managers so chosen and their successors shall and may make such by-laws, rules, orders and regulations not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of the United States, nor of this State, as shall be necessary for the well ordering the affairs of the said company, and generally have like powers, authorities and privileges necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, and be entitled to like tolls and profits in proportion to the distance, as are given and granted to the president, managers and company of the Susquehanna and York borough turnpike road; *Provided*, That if the said company shall not proceed to carry on the said work in three years after the passing of this act, or shall not within seven years afterwards, complete the said road according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises hereby granted to the said company, shall revert to this commonwealth.

One president, six managers, treasurer and other officers to be chosen by ballot;

authorized to make by-laws, &c. under certain restrictions.

Company to enjoy similar powers, &c. subject to similar restrictions with those of the Susquehanna, and York Borough turnpike road.

CHAPTER XXIV.

An ACT to ratify on behalf of the state of Pennsylvania, a proposed amendment of the constitution of the United States, relative to titles of nobility, or honour, presents, pensions, offices and emoluments from any foreign power.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the following amendment of the constitution of the United States, proposed by the congress of the United States, in the mode prescribed by the fifth article of the constitution; viz. "If any citizen of the United States shall accept, claim, receive, or retain any title of nobility or honour, or shall without the consent of congress, accept and retain any present, pension, office or emolument of any kind whatever, from any emperor, king, prince, or foreign power, such person shall cease to be a citizen of the United States, and shall be incapable of holding*

CHAPTER XXV.

An ACT to enable the governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road from the south side of Michael Geiselman's mill, adjoining the town of Berlin, in the county of Adams, through Abbotstown to Hanover, in York county.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Samuel Fahnestock, John B. Arnold, William Paterson, Borrius Fahnestock, Tobias Kepner, and Frederick Bougher, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to do and perform the several things hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, they shall on or before the first Monday of June next, procure two books, and in each of them enter as follows, “We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company of the Berlin and Hanover turnpike road, the sum of fifty dollars for every share of stock in said company, set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the president and managers of the said company, in pursuance of an act of the general assembly of this commonwealth, entitled, “An act to enable the governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road from the south side of Michael Geiselman's mill, adjoining the town of Berlin, in the county of Adams, through Abbotstown to Hanover, in York county, and shall thereupon give notice in three of the public newspapers, one in the town of Hanover, one in York, and one in Gettysburgh, for four weeks at least, of the times and places when and where the said books shall be kept open to receive subscriptions for the stock of the said company at which respective times and places*
