CHAPTER XXXI.

An ACT to confer on Armantine Monges and Arman Monges the right and benefits of children born in lawful wedlock.

WHEREAS John Armantaire Monges, of the city of Philadelphia, a naturalized citizen of the United States, hath represented to the legislature, that previously to his marriage with Janne Barbe Garnier, widow Breban, he had by her two children, to wit, a daughter named Armantine and a son named Arman, and subsequently to their marriage several other children, two of whom are now living, and that his said wife is deceased, and he hath prayed the legislature to confer on the said children born before his said marriage the rights and benefits belonging to legitimate issue; And whereas, it appears proper by legislative interposition to introduce equality and promote harmony among the children of the same family:

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the said Armantine Monges and Arman Monges, the children of the said John Armantaire Monges and Janne Barbe Garnier, widow Breban, shall respectively have and enjoy all the rights, benefits and advantages of children born in lawful wedlock, and shall be able and capable in law to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever as fully and completely to all intents and purposes as if they had respectively been born subsequently to the intermarriage of their aforesaid parents.
