SECT. VII. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said trustees under the penalty of forty dollars each, to be recovered for the use of the said corporation as debts to that amount are by law recoverable, shall annually exhibit all their books, accounts, and vouchers of every kind to the auditors of the said county of Erie, to be settled, adjusted, and published in the same manner as the accounts of the county commissioners are by law directed to be settled, adjusted and published.

SECT. VIII. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the trustees herein before appointed, and their successors in office, shall before they enter on the duties of their trust before any judge or justice of the peace of this state, take and subscribe the oaths or affirmations prescribed by the constitution of this state to be taken by the officers of the state; and shall also take and subscribe an oath or affirmation for the faithful discharge of their respective trusts or office aforesaid.

CHAPTER CXXII.

*A further SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled, "An act to enable the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the city of Philadelphia, by Chad's ford on Brandywine, to the line of the state in a direction towards Baltimore,"*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall and may be lawful for the president, managers, and company of the Philadelphia, Brandywine and New-London turnpike road, to make and complete the same over and upon the road leading from the permanent bridge over

Philadelphia, &c. turnpike to be carried over the woodlands road.

Schuylkill to Darby, commonly called the Woodlands road, where said road diverges from the Philadelphia and Lancaster turnpike; *Provided*, That no toll gate shall be erected at any time hereafter on that part of said road over which the turnpike may be made.

Proviso.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That it shall be lawful for the said president, managers and company to make and complete the said road on and over the hills at and near Crum, Ridley and Chester creeks, at an angle not exceeding four and a half degrees from a horizontal line.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the notification to the stockholders of the company of the time and place appointed for the payment of any proportion of dividend of the capital stock, in order to carry on the work, shall be given in two of the public newspapers printed in the city of Philadelphia, and one in the county of Chester.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That so much of the act to which this is a supplement as is hereby altered or supplied shall be so far and no farther repealed.

### CHAPTER CXXIII.

*An ACT declaring Huntingdon creek from the mouth thereof to where Pine creek empties into the same; thence up Pine creek to Amos Buckelew's saw-mill in the county of Northumberland, public highways.*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That Huntingdon creek from the mouth thereof; thence up the same to the mouth of Pine creek; thence up Pine creek to Amos Buckelew's saw-mill; shall be, and the same are hereby declared public highways under the limitations and restrictions herein after specified; and it shall and may be lawful for any person or persons desirous of improving or using the navigation of said streams to remove thereout all obstructions except mill-dams already built, at which dams the person or persons aforesaid shall have full power to make slopes thereon and keep the same in repair for ever for the passage of boats or rafts.
