And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said trustees under the penalty of forty dollars each, to be recovered for the use of the said corporation as debts to that amount are by law recoverable, shall annually exhibit all their books, accounts, and vouchers of every kind to the auditors of the said county of Erie, to be settled, adjusted, and published in the same manner as the accounts of the county commissioners are by law directed to be settled, adjusted and published.
