An ACT to increase the number of constables in the boroughs of Lancaster and Easton.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, the electors residing in the borough of Lancaster, shall, on the third Friday in March, yearly, and every year thereafter, elect eight suitable persons, being citizens of the said borough, for the office of constable; and shall return the names of the persons so elected, to the next general court of quarter sessions of the peace, to be holden for the county of Lancaster, and the court shall appoint four of them to serve as constables for the said borough, conformably to law.
