

CHAPTER XCIX.

An ACT to annul the marriage of Benjamin Harrison and Margaret his wife.

WHEREAS it hath been represented by the petition of Margaret Harrison, of the township of the Northern Liberties, and county of Philadelphia, that she contracted marriage with Benjamin Harrison on the twenty-ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and two ; that shortly after their intermarriage her said husband regardless of his matrimonial vows, commenced a series of abusive conduct towards her and neglected to provide for his young and rising family, and in contempt of the laws of God and man, gave himself up to an irregular life :

Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into by the said Benjamin Harrison and Margaret his wife, be and the same is hereby declared to be null and void, and the parties respectively set free and discharged therefrom, and from all the rights and duties arising under the same, as fully and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage ; but nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect or render illegitimate, any child or children born of the body of the said Margaret during her coverture.

CHAPTER C.

An ACT to change the name of Jesse Homer, to that of Jesse Henderson Jones.

BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Jesse Homer, of the city of Philadelphia, shall hereafter be known by the name of Jesse Henderson Jones, and by this name shall be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, grant and receive, and to do all other legal acts, as effectually

CHAPTER CI.

An ACT to compensate John Shook, for services in the late American revolution.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to John Shook, of Northampton county, or his order, sixty dollars immediately after the passage of this act, as full compensation for pay due him for service rendered in the late war with Great Britain.

CHAPTER CII.

An ACT authorizing the governor to purchase from Farrand, Hopkins, Zantzinger, and company, five hundred copies of Purdon's abridgment of the laws of Pennsylvania, and to provide for the distribution thereof.

Governor authorized to purchase 500 copies of Purdon's abridgment.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized and required to purchase from Farrand, Hopkins, Zantzinger, and Co. five hundred copies of "Purdon's abridgment of the laws of Pennsylvania," to be well bound and lettered: *Provided,* the same be delivered at the secretary's office, in good condition at any price not exceeding four dollars and fifty cents per copy.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said abridgment shall be disposed of by the secreta-
