SECT. XXVI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* Centre.
 That the electors of Miles township, in the county of Cen-
 tre, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house
 now occupied by Godfrey Harloff, in the town of Resersburg,
 in the said township.

SECT. XXVII. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* Northamp-
 That the township of Lausanne, in the county of Northamp- ton.
 ton, shall be annexed to the election district, composed of
 Toamensing, and East Penn; and the electors thereof shall
 hold their general elections at the house now occupied by
 John Klutz, in Lehigh town, in East Penn township.

SECT. XXVIII. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* Same.
 That Bethlehem township, in the county of Northampton,
 and that part of Hanover, not included in the bounds of Le-
 high county, shall be a separate election district; and the
 electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house
 of George Butz, in Bethlehem township.

CHAPTER CXXXVIII.

An ACT in aid of the Centre turnpike road.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of represen-*
tatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly
met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That
 after the first day of August next, the governor be, and he is
 hereby authorized to subscribe on behalf of this common- 300 shares of
 wealth, for three hundred shares of the stock of the Centre stock to be
 turnpike road, leading from Reading to Sunbury, in addition subscribed
 to the six hundred shares heretofore subscribed in the stock for.

CHAPTER CXXXIX.

An ACT for the relief of sundry inhabitants of the county of Adams, adjoining the manor of Mask.

SECT. I. *BE* it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That an abatement of interest from the eighteenth day of June, in the year one thousand seven hundred and forty-one, until the eighteenth day of June in the year one thousand seven hundred and sixty-five, shall be made on the purchase money due by the original settlers and their legal representatives, who were excluded by the established boundary of the manor of Mask, from being within the same, and who were prevented from perfecting their title in consequence of the dispute respecting the boundaries of said manor, of which prevention the list of entries now in the office shall be sufficient evidence in favour of those whose names are therein, or the names under whom they claim; and the secretary of the land-office is hereby directed to credit the said purchasers respectively, on their final adjustment with such exoneration; *Provided nevertheless*, that the aforesaid original settlers, or their legal representatives, come forward and pay the purchase money, and remaining interest, to the treasury of this commonwealth, and take patents for the same within one year from and after the passing
