CHAPTER CXLII.

An ACT to revise and continue the act, entitled “ An act authorizing the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road, from the river Schuylkill, at Reading, in the county of Berks, to or near Hummelstown, in the county of Dauphin.”

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same; That

Hollingsworth, Jacob Greenawalt, John Fox, William Louer, Jacob Boas, Christian Kunkel, George Brenizer, George Zeigler, and Henry Moyer, of the county of Dauphin, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to perform the several duties hereinafter mentioned, *that is to say*, they shall procure eight books, and in each of them enter as follows: “ We, the subscribers, promise to pay to the president, managers and company, of Berks and Dauphin turnpike road company, the sum of fifty dollars for every share set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the said company, in pursuance of an act of the general assembly, entitled “ An act authorizing the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the river Schuylkill at Reading, in the county of Berks, to or near Hummelstown, in the county of Dauphin.” Witness our hands the day of in the year one thousand eight hundred and ;” and shall give notice in the public newspapers printed in the city of Philadelphia, in

Reading, in Lebanon, and Harrisburgh, for two weeks at least, of the times and places when and where the said books will be opened to receive subscriptions of stock for the company, at which respective times and places, some three of the said commissioners shall attend, and shall permit and suffer all persons who shall offer to subscribe in the said books, in which any person of the age of twenty-one years shall be at liberty to subscribe in his or her own name, or any other name or names by whom he or she shall be authorized, for any number of shares in the said stock, until two thousand one hundred shares, shall in the whole be subscribed; and every person offering to subscribe in the said books, shall previously pay to the attending commissioners, five dollars for every share to be by him or her subscribed, out of which shall be defrayed the expense of taking subscriptions and other incidental charges, and the remainder shall be paid over to the treasurer of the corporation as soon as the same shall be organized.

CHAPTER CXLIII.
