CHAPTER CXLIV.

*A SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled "An act authorizing the governor to purchase from Farrand, Hopkins, Zantzinger, and company, five hundred copies of Purdon's abridgment of the laws of Pennsylvania, and to provide for the distribution thereof."*

§ 2250 to be paid to Farrand, Hopkins, and Co.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the governor of this commonwealth is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favour of Farrand, Hopkins, Zantzinger, and company, for the sum of two thousand two hundred and fifty dollars, as soon as the said firm, shall have delivered to the secretary of the commonwealth, five hundred copies of Purdon's abridgment of the laws of Pennsylvania, which the governor was required to purchase, by the act to which this act is a supplement.
