CHAPTER CXLIX.

An ACT appropriating a sum of money for completing the new prison in the city and county of Philadelphia, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvinia, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars be, and is hereby appropriated, to be paid after the first day of August next, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, on warrants drawn by the governor in favour of the board of inspectors of the city and county of Philadelphia, to be by them applied in completing the new prison in the city and county aforesaid, and the payment of debts already accrued in building the same; and the said board of inspectors shall furnish and subaccounts to be mit a detailed statement of their accounts to the accountant department, when called upon for that purpose, by the auditorgeneral, to be settled and adjusted in the usual manner; Frovided always, that the governor shall have full power to draw warrants for said money in such instalments only, as in his opinion the progress of the work in finishing and completing said prison, will justify, and the public interest require. SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,

That immediately after the said prison shall be completed, and suitable for the admission of prisoners, the said inspectors may if they think proper, cause to be removed thereunto, all or any of the persons, convicted of crimes and misdemeanors, that may be then confined in the prison of the city and county of Philadelphia, and if necessary, to receive into the said to be received new prison, from time to time, all persons of the aforesaid description, that may hereafter be convicted in this commonwealth, and subject to hard labour, by the existing laws, in the jail and penitentiary house of the city of Philadelphia, and the said new prison shall be hereafter, considered, deemed and taken to be the exclusive property of this commonwealth, and subject to such regulations as the legislature may from Part of a for-time to time deem necessary and prope : And provided, that so much of the act, passed the second day of April, one thou-

CHAPTER CL.
