## CHAPTER CLXVIL

An ACT authorizing the courts of quarter sessions of Butler and Mercer counties, to direct a review of parts of certain state roads therein mentioned.

Sect. 1. ## CHAPTER CLXIX.

An ACT dissolving the marriage of Elsa Middough, and Leui Middough.

WHEREAS it appears to the legislature, that Elsa Vangorden was, on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, joined in marriage to Levi Middough, with whom she lived about fourteen years, in which time she had five children; that during the time the said Elsa continued to live with the said Levi, he treated her in a most cruel and inhuman manner, by beating her, and at different times threatening to take her life, so that she was often obliged to fly to her neighbours for protection, and it also appears that the said Elsa is a woman of good moral character: And whereas, it would be cruel in the extreme to oblige a woman to live with a man that has continued so in-

humanly and barbarously to treat her. Therefore,

SECT. 1.
