

CHAPTER IV.

An ACT to authorize the select and common councils of the city of Philadelphia, to erect a market house in the said city, for the sale of fish, exclusively.

The select and common councils to erect a market house for the sale of fish exclusively.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the select and common councils of the city of Philadelphia. to cause a suitable market-house to be erected for the sale of fish within the said city, in High-street, east of Front street ; and to make such regulations (not inconsistent with the laws of this commonwealth) for the good government of the said market, as to them shall appear use ul and expedient; and to demand reasonable fees, tolls or rents, from all the tenants and occupants of the stands or stalls, within the said market, for the use thereof, any law to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding : provided, that the preference to said stalls shall at all times be given to persons following the occupation of fishermen.

CHAPTER V.

An ACT to repeal an act, entitled, " An act for the relief of insolvent debtors, residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, and their creditors," passed the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twelve.

The insolvent law of 1812 repealed.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the act entitled " An act for the relief of insolvent debtors residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, and their creditors," passed the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, be and the same is hereby repealed.
