CHAPTER VI.

An ACT supplementary to an act, entitled, " An act to extend the powers of the Gettysburg and Petersburg turnpike company, and to enable the governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road from a point near Gallagher's saw mill, to the borough of Chambersburg."

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Governor to appoint the person as the Gettysburg and Petersburg turnpike company sons to view and examine, &c. shall have perfected an artificial road from the court-house, in the borough of Gertysburg, to the German church on the lands of Jacob Middlekauff, the president and managers of said company, or a majority of them, shall give notice thereof to the governor, who shall thereupon forthwith nominate and appoint three disinterested persons to view and examine the same, and to report to him in writing, whether the said road is so far executed in a masterly and workmanlike manner, according to the true intent and meaning of the act, to which this is a supplement; and if the report shall be in the affirmative, then the governor The governor to license and pershall by license under his hand and the less seal of the common-mit said company to the common-mit said company to the common of t wealth, permit the said company to erect a gate or turnpike on and &. across that part of the road which shall be reported to him to be finished in the manner aforesaid, and to receive the like tolls and profits in proportion to the distance, as are given to them by the act of assembly under which they were incorporated.

CHAPTER VII.

An ACT to revive and continue certain acts therein mentioned relative to the patenting of land.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the provisions of the act entitled, "An act relating to the patenting of land," passed the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ten, shall be and the same hereby The extension of are continued until the first day of January, in the year of our time for patent-Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and no longer:

Proviso.

provided nevertheless, that nothing herein contained, shall be construed or so understood, as to entitle any person or persons, or corporate bodies, executors or administrators, on behalf of each minor, to the benefit of this act for any greater quantity than five hundred acres of land held by him, her or them, in his, her, or their own right.

Certain provi-sions re-enacted.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all the provisions of the act, entitled, "An act to encourage the patenting of lands, north and west of the rivers Ohio, Allegheny, and Conewango creek, by mortgage and for other purposes," passed the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall be, and the same are hereby reenacted and continued, until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, and no longer.

SECT. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, Other provisions That the act, entitled, "An act to provide for the payment of certain balances of purchase money yet due, and remaining charged on lands which have been patented, on warrants obtained since surveys were originally made in pursuance of old proprietary warrants and locations, and for other purposes," passed on the second April, one thousand eight hundred and four, and which has expired, be and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue and remain in full force until the first of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifteen.

SECT. IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the provisions of the third and fourth sections of the act, entitled, "A further supplement to the act, entitled, "An act offering compensation to the Pennsylvania claimants of certain lands in the seventeen townships in the county of Luzerne, and for other purposes therein mentioned," passed the twentythird of January, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall be and the same are hereby re-enacted extended and continued, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and no longer.
