CHAPTER XLII.

An ACT for the relief of George Nagle.

WHEREAS John M'Nair of Allen township, in the county of Northampton, and commonwealth of Pennsylvania, on the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine, purchased at public sale, of the agents appointed for the sale of confiscated estates, a tract of one hundred and eighty nine acres and ninety-nine perches, situate in Allen township aforesaid, as the estate of Andrew Allen, which tract of land has by lawful conveyance been since vested in George Nagle: and wbereas, the said George Nagle, was in October, one thousand eight hundred and nine, by due course of law, evicted from the said premises, by a title paramount in a certain Margaret Delancy of the kingdom of Great Britain: Therefore.

SECT. I. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to George Nagle, or his order, two thousand three hundred and thirteen dollars and nine cents, as full compensation for all costs and damages which he has sustained in consequence of his being evicted by due course of law, from a tract of one hundred and eighty-nine acres and ninety-nine perches of land, in Allen township, in the county of Northampton which he held under a title derived from this commonwealth: provided always, that any money that may be due to the commonwealth by the said Nagle, in his own right, or as security for said M'Nair, on mortgage granted to the commonwealth, by
