CHAPTER XLIII.

An ACT granting aid, to erect a bridge across Licking creek in the county of Bedford.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of two hundred dollars be, and the same hereby is appropriated to be paid on warrants drawn by the auditor general on the state treasurer, to the commissioners of Bedford county, for erecting a bridge over Licking creek where the road from Mercersburg, passing by Hunter's and Steward's mills, to Bedford, crosses said creek.

## CHAPTER XLV.

*An ACT for the relief of John Bioren.*

WHEREAS by virtue of an act passed on the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ten, and of another act passed on the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, the governor of this commonwealth contracted with John Bioren, for the printing of Smith's edition of the laws, at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents for each volume, of six hundred pages: *and whereas*, the fifth volume of the said edition contains two hundred and seventy pages more than the contract required, for which it is but just that compensation should be made: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the accounting officers of this commonwealth be and they are hereby required in the settlement of John Bioren's accounts, to allow him compensation for printing two hundred and seventy pages of the fifth volume of Smith's edition of the laws, at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents for six hundred pages.
