SECT. VI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby authorized and required to settle and adjust the accounts of Wilson Smith, quarter-master general of this state, including the pay and rations, and all necessary expenses of the militia employed in the defence of Erie, under the orders of the governor, of those who had previously entered on that service at the request of brigadier general John Kelso; and also of the rations issued to those men who volunteered their services without any orders for the defence of Erie, at the time of the general alarm, and likewise to allow the said quarter-master general the pay and emoluments of a colonel, in full compensation for all services of whatever kind; and having so settled the accounts, the auditor general shall draw his warrant on the state treasurer, for the balance found due to him, which shall be paid out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury.

CHAPTER XLIX.

An ACT for the relief of Charles Bisson and John Colman old soldiers.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay unto Charles Bisson, of Montgomery county or order, the sum of forty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of forty dollars, to be paid half yearly, during life, to commence the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.

CHAPTER L.

An ACT vacating certain streets in the district of Southwark, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of a street of the width of forty feet, extending from Carpenter-street to Mariott's lane, in the district of Southwark, and county of Philadelphia, as is not included within the limits of Fifth-street containing on Carpenter-street forty feet, and extending on the west side of Fifth-street, two hundred and fifteen feet nine inches to a point at the south west corner of Fifth-street, Mariott's lane, and the forty feet street aforesaid, be and the same is hereby vacated.*

Part of a certain street from Carpenter's to Mariott's lane, vacated.

SECT II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of a street of the width of fifty feet, extending from Prune-street to Christian-street, in the district of Southwark, in the county of Philadelphia, as is not included within the limits of Delaware, Third-street continued, be and the same is hereby vacated.*

CHAPTER LI.

An ACT to continue an act, entitled, "An act to incorporate the Phoenix Insurance company of Philadelphia."

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly*
