CHAPTER LXX.

An ACT to grant compensation for extra services, to the militia of this commonwealth now in service, under the command of General William Henry Harrison.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That in case any of the militia of this commonwealth, now under the command of General William Henry Harrison, shall agree to serve for a term not more than two months from and after the first day of April next, and provided the whole or any part of such militia shall volunteer and subject themselves to the orders of the commander in chief of the north-western army, to perform such service as he may require of them, a bounty at the rate of twelve dollars per month, shall be paid out of the treasury of this state, to each commissioned and staff officer, and also to each non-commissioned officer, musician and private, his or their legal representatives; and the bounty so allowed, shall be apportioned and paid to such volunteers, for and according to the time they shall respectively continue to serve, after the expiration of their present term of service: provided, that if any of the said militia who shall volunteer as aforesaid shall be killed in battle, or die during the time for which he shall have volunteered as aforesaid, his legal representatives shall receive the bounty for the whole period for which he volunteered, and for which his services were accepted.

12 dollars per month granted to militia who shall volunteer their services for two months after their present term of service shall expire.

Bounty to be apportioned according to their time of service.

Proviso in favor of the heirs, or legal representatives of such as may be slain.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to appoint an agent or paymaster, whose duty it shall be, immediately after the return of the detachment or detachments entitled to the benefit of this act, to appoint some convenient place within the bounds of each brigade, from which the militia have

been drafted, for the payment of the men within the brigades respectively, of which time and place, public notice shall be given by said agent, at which places the said paymaster or agent shall attend, and pay the men the sums of money they are entitled to by this act; and the said agent or paymaster, before he enters on the duties of his appointment, shall give bond with sufficient security to the governor, for the use of the commonwealth, for the faithful performance of his duties, and shall furnish and exhibit all his accounts, receipts, and pay-rolls, to the auditor general for settlement.

Paymaster to give bond with sureties.

His accounts, &c. to be exhibited to auditor general.

Commanding officer to furnish copies of pay-rolls.

One to be furnished to the paymaster and one to the auditor general.

Copies of this act to be sent to General Harrison, and the commanding officer of the detachment of Pennsylvania militia, also inform him of the name of the paymaster.

Paymaster's compensation.

Governor to draw his warrant on the treasurer.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the governor be and he is hereby required to direct the brigadier general or commanding officer of the detachment of the militia of this state, to cause two certified copies of the pay-rolls of the said troops under his command who shall have volunteered their services according to the meaning of this act, to be made out, one of which the said commanding officer shall cause to be sent to the auditor general, and the other he shall cause to be furnished to the agent or paymaster appointed under this act, at Pittsburg, for the purpose of paying off the said troops in the manner directed by this act, and it shall be the duty of the governor immediately after the passing of this act, to send one copy thereof by mail, or otherwise, to General William Henry Harrison, and one other copy to the officer commanding the detachment aforesaid, and also to inform the said commanding officer of the appointment of the agent and paymaster aforesaid, who shall be allowed, and paid, two per cent. on the whole amount he shall have paid, as a compensation for his services as agent or paymaster.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for whatever sum of money may be necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this act.
