### CHAPTER LXXVII.

*An ACT directing the state treasurer to refund any monies received from the estate of Thomas Gallagher, deceased.*

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

Money paid from the estate of Thomas Gallagher into the state treasury to be refunded.

That the sum of money paid into the state treasury on account of the loan office, of one thousand seven hundred and ninety-three; by the treasurers of Mifflin county, and which was received from the estate of Thomas Gallagher, deceased, which was intended by the act of the sixth of March, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, to be relinquished to the estate aforesaid, shall be, and the state treasurer is hereby authorized to refund the same to Lydia Gallagher, administratrix of the late Thomas Gallagher, deceased, for the use of herself, and the estate of the said deceased.

### CHAPTER LXXVIII.

*An ACT to continue and amend "An act entitled, an act to incorporate the Philadelphia Insurance Company."*

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the "Act entitled an act to incorporate the Philadelphia Insurance*

Charter of the Philadelphia

Company," passed the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and four, be and the same is hereby continued in full force and operation, for the term of twenty years from and after the thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, the limitation in the fifteenth section thereof to the contrary notwithstanding; *provided*, that if it shall at any time appear, that the privileges hereby renewed and granted, are injurious to the interests of this commonwealth, the legislature shall be at liberty to annul them.

Insurance company extended for 20 years after 31st. December, 1814.

Proviso. Legislative power to annul the charter if found injurious.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That from and after the thirty-first day of December, which will be in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, the board of directors shall not permit any transfer or assignment of the stock of the said company to be made to any person not a citizen of the United States, and in case any such transfer should nevertheless be made, the same shall be to all intents null and void.

Stock not to be held by foreigners.

CHAPTER LXXIX.

*An ACT granting to Matthew Knox two tracts of donation land.*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the land officers be, and they are hereby directed to draw and patent two tracts of donation land, containing two hundred acres each, to Matthew Knox, of Montgomery county, formerly a lieutenant in the army of the United States, in the revolutionary war:

Two tracts of donation land granted Matthew Knox.
