CHAPTER LXXXIII.

An ACT to confer on James Fleming, the younger, the rights and benefits of a child born in lawful wedlock.

Sect. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, James Fleming and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That legitimated. James Fleming, the younger, a son of James and Rebecca Fleming, (late Rebecca Oglesby,) of Chester county, and born some time before the marriage of the said James and Rebecca Fleming, shall have and enjoy all the rights, benefits and advantages of a child born in lawful wedlock, and shall be able and capable in law, to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever, as fully and completely, to all intents and purposes as if he had been born subsequently to the intermarriage of his aforesaid parents.

CHAPTER LXXXIV.

An ACT to grant a sum of money to the Bustleton academy, in the county of Philadelphia.

Sect. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That soo dollars grante the sum of five hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby enacted by the flustrens according and out of any money not heretofore appropriated, which pair may be in the treasury of this commonwealth, to the trustees of the Bustleton academy, to be paid on a warrant drawn by the governor for that purpose, to be appropriated by them in such manner as they shall think most advantageous in repairing the academy.
