CHAPTER LXXXV.

In ACT authorizing Andrew Swearingen, guardian of Elizabeth Taylor, a minor, to sell a lot of ground therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to the legislature, that under an order of the orphans' court of Washington county, directing a partition of the real estate of General Henry Taylor, late of the county aforesaid, deceased, among the legatees, that the share which has fallen to Elizabeth Taylor, a minor, is in two parts, and at a distance from each other, that one of the said parts containing twenty-two acres, is unproductive; and that it would be for the advantage of said minor that sale was made thereof: Therefore,

Andrew Swearingen authorized to sell lands.

Proceeds to be appropriated to the use of E. Taylor, a minor. Surety to be given to the court.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives. of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, Andrew Swearingen, guardian of Elizabeth Taylor, a minor. daughter of Henry Taylor, late of Washington county, deceased, be and he is hereby authorized to sell and convey to the highest bidder, either by public or private sale, a lot of ground situate in Strabane township, and county aforesaid, containing twenty-two acres, adjoining lands of James Martin, James Linn, and others, and the said guardian shall dispose of and apply the monies arising out of such sale, as shall be adjudged most for the benefit and advantage of said minor, by the purchase of other lands, and the said guardian shall prior to his making sale of the said lot of land give security which shall be satisfactory, to the orphans' court of the said county, for the faithful performance of the trust committed to and reposed in him by this act: provided always, that the right of any other individual or individuals are hereby as fully reserved as if this act had not been passed.

CHAPTER LXXXVI.

An ACT for the relief of James Shields, of Indiana county, an old soldier.

the state treasurer pay unto James Shields, of Indiana county, annuity granted or order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, to commence the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, to be paid half yearly during his life.

CHAPTER LXXXVII.

An ACT to confirm the title of Abraham Walker to a certain tract of land in Bedford county.

WHEREAS Abraham Walker, on the eighth day of March, eighteen hundred and eleven, not being at that time a citizen of the United States, nor having declared his intention of becoming a citizen, obtained a patent from the commonwealth for three hundred and iforty four acres, and one hundred and fifty-four perches of land, situate in Belfast township, Bedford county, adjoining land of Isaac Gray, Henry Davis and others; and whereas, he has since declared his intention of becoming a citizen of the United States: Therefore,

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Title to a tract the right and title of the said Abraham Walker, in and to the of land, confirm said tract of land with the appurtenances, be and the same is Walker, hereby confirmed and made as valid, as if the said Abraham Walker had been a citizen at the time of his purchase of the same, provided, that nothing herein shall be construed to defeat, or affect the right of any other person.

CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

An ACT for the relief of Elizabeth Currens, in the county of Chester.

WHEREAS Timothy Currens, late of the township of East Nottingham, in the county of Chester, died intestate and
