That Thomas Wilson and Jacob Wight, administrators of Casper Wight, deceased, are hereby authorized to make and execute a good and sufficient title to John Barlet, his heirs and assigns for a tract of land situate in Antis township, Huntingdon county, agreeably to the division made of the said tract of land, between John Barlet and the deceased, as the same is meted and bounded; which title shall be as good and available in law as if it had been made by the said Casper Wight in his life time; provided, that nothing in this act contained, shall be understood to injure or prejudice the right of any other individual or individuals.
