SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That for the purpose of making the purchase contemplated in the foregoing section, the sum of fifty thousand dollars shall be immediately placed at the disposal of the governor, out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury.

50 000 dollars appropriated for the foregoing purposes.

## CHAPTER CXXXV.

An ACT to dissolve the marriage contract of William Wason, and Jemima his wife.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature, that William Wason, of Franklin county, and Jemima Wilkinson, were joined in marriage on the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, and that at a court of quarter sessions for Franklin county, (last November term,) she was convicted on two indictments for larceny, and is at present confined in the jail of said county: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the marriage contract entered into by and between William Wason and Jemima Wilkinson, shall be and is hereby dissolved, annulled and made void, and that the said William Wason and Jemima his wife are released and set free from the contract, and from all rights, obligations and duties, by reason of said contract and marriage, as if the same had never been entered into; but nothing herein contained, shall be con-

CHAPTER CXXXVI.

An ACT to repeal the act, entitled, “ An act to repeal the act,  
entitled, “ An act for the limitation of actions to be brought  
for the inheritance or possession of real property, or upon  
penal acts of assembly, in all cases where title has been at any  
time claimed under the Susquebanna company or the state of  
Connecticut.”

Certain acts re-  
pealed.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representa-  
tives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly  
met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That  
two years from and after the passing this act, the act entitled,  
“ An act to repeal the act for the limitations of actions to be  
brought for the inheritance or possession of real property, or  
upon penal acts of assembly, in all cases where title has at any  
time been claimed under the Susquehanna company or the  
state of Connecticut,” passed March the eleventh, one thou-  
sand eight hundred, shall be and the same is hereby declared  
to be repealed; and the act of March the twenty-sixth, one  
thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, entitled, “ An act  
for the limitation of actions to be brought for the inheritance  
or possession of real property, or upon penal acts of assem-  
bly,” shall after the expiration of the said two years, be taken  
and construed to extend as fully and effectually to that part of  
the commonwealth against every person or persons whosoever,  
except those who shall have brought their action or actions for  
the recovery of their possessions within the said period of  
two years, as in any other parts of the same.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,  
That the secretary of the commonwealth be and he is hereby  
required to cause this act to be published weekly, for four  
weeks, in two of the newspapers published in the city of Phi-  
ladelphia.
