CHAPTER CXXXIX.

An ACT authorizing a loan of money to Caleb Johnson, of the borough of Harrisburg.

WHEREAS Caleb Johnson hath established a furnace in the borough of Harrisburg, for the purpose of casting hinges, weights, &c. which if properly prosecuted, would be of great advantage to the citizens of this state; which for want of sufficient capital, he is unable to do, and having petitioned the legislature for a loan of money to enable him to carry on the same to advantage: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of six hundred dollars be loaned to Caleb Johnson to be paid on warrant drawn by the governor, out of any money in the treasury, he the said Caleb Johnson first giving bond with security to the satisfaction of the governor, for the repayment thereof, with interest in three years; provided, that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prevent the payment of said loan or any part thereof, at any time before the expiration of the said three years.*

CHAPTER CXL.

An ACT granting donation lands to the widow and children of William Noble, late a sergeant in the revolutionary war, and to Robert Hamilton, an old soldier.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general as-*

sembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,
That the officers of the land office be and they are hereby required to draw and patent, to the widow and children of William Noble, late a sergeant in the revolutionary war, a tract of donation land containing two hundred acres.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,*
That the land officers be and they are hereby directed to draw and patent a tract of donation land, containing two hundred acres, unto Robert Hamilton, an old soldier in the revolutionary war.

CHAPTER CXLI.

An ACT to enable William Boor and Lewis Zering, administrators of Adam Greigher, late of Allen township, in the county of Cumberland, deceased, to convey a tract of land to Philip Pizel.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to the legislature, that Adam Greigher, in his life time did sell unto Philip Pizel, a tract of land situate in Monaghan township, in the county of York, containing about fifty-six acres, and that said Philip Pizel is willing to pay agreeably to the terms of the contract, on receiving a deed of conveyance for the said tract of land; and it also appearing that the said Adam Greigher died intestate, leaving some of his children in their minority, and the administrators aforesaid being willing and desirous to complete the title of the said Philip Pizel to the said tract of land, but cannot legally do it as there is no written evidence of the said contract: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That William Boor and Lewis Zering, administrators, of Adam Greigher, deceased, be and they are hereby authorized to make and execute a deed of conveyance to the aforesaid Philip Pizel, and to his heirs and assigns, for the aforesaid tract of land, according to the true intent and meaning of the parole agreement made between the said Adam Greigher
