CHAPTER CLXV.

An ACT establishing a public ferry on the south side of the west branch of the Susquebanna river, in the county of Lycoming, and to vest the right thereof in John Myers, his beirs and assigns.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives, of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, John Myers, &c. That John Myers, his heirs and assigns, shall have the right at his or their own proper cost and charges, to make a good and convenient landing on the south side of the west branch of the river Susquehanna, on the estate of the said John Myers, and where the post road from Williamsport to Bellefonte crosses the said river above the head of the Great Island and opposite Dunnstown; and the owner or occupier shall keep the same in good order and repair, fit for men, horses, waggons carts and carriages to pass, and the said owner and occupier shall keep good and substantial boats and flats, and careful ferrymen, who shall constantly as occasion may require, attend for the purpose of transporting travellers and others over the said river, and for services rendered, shall receive such price as is customarily paid at other ferries on said branch, and the said ferry moreover shall be subject to such rates and regulations as the court of general quarter sessions of the peace in and for the county of Lycoming shall from time to time order and direct; provided always, that nothing in this act contained shall be construed so as to vest in the said John Myers or his legal representatives, the right to receive or discharge any travellers, carriages, or other loading on land belonging to any other person, without the consent of the owner or occupier.

CHAPTER CLXVI.

An ACT for the relief of sundry landbolders in the manor of Springetsbury, in the county of York.

WHEREAS it has been represented to this legislature, that divers persons holding lands in the manor of Springetsbury, by warrants dated prior to the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine, did since that time pay into the land office of this commonwealth, the arrearages due on their said lands, and took out patents for the same; and others took out warrants for vacancies and lands held by settlement rights, and paid for the same into the land office of this commonwealth; since which time it has been decided in the circuit court of the United States, that the title of the said manor of Springetsbury is in the proprietors and not in this commonwealth, whereby the said patentees and warrantees are deprived of deriving any advantage from the payment of the aforesaid money for their said patents and warrants ; Therefore,

SECT. I. Be it enacted by the senate and bouse of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Duty of the de-the deputy surveyor of York county be authorized and requir- York county. ed to ascertain from the books and surveys, or otherwise, in his office at the expense of the holders, what tracts or parts of tracts of land in the manor of Springetsbury have been patented under this commonwealth, and also what warrants which have issued out of the land office of this commonwealth have been executed on land within the bounds of the said manor of Springetsbury, and certify the same to the surveyor general as soon as may be; whereupon the board of property shall ascertain the Board of propersaid several sums of money which have been paid into the the auditor geneland office on account of the aforesaid patents and warrants, rai, &c. together with interest thereon from the time of the said payment or payments, and certify to the auditor general the amount and by whom paid; whereupon the auditor general is Who is authorize hereby authorized and required to draw his warrant on the warrant, &c.
