

CHAPTER CLXXVI.

AN SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled, " An act for establishing and building a bridge across the river Schuylkill at or near the Falls thereof," passed the twenty-second of February, one thousand eight hundred and eight.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Schuylkill Falls bridge company.
 the president and managers of the Schuylkill Falls bridge company, be and they are hereby authorized to demand and receive from travellers and others for passing or using the said bridge, according to the following rates, that is to say, for every chaise, riding chair or sulkey, with one horse, four cents; for every horse or mule with or without a rider, two cents in addition to the rates authorized to be collected by the act to which this is a supplement, and also a further advance of one fourth on all other rates allowed and authorized to be levied for crossing the said bridge by the act aforesaid; *provided, that the authority given the said company by this act, to demand and receive the additional rates above mentioned, shall, whenever the stockholders are enabled thereby to receive six per cent. for the sums by them subscribed, be reduced to the rates specified in the act to which this is a supplement, any thing contained in this act to the contrary notwithstanding; provided always, that the said company* To receive the following rates of toll.
 shall once in every three years submit to the legislature a full and complete statement of their capital stock and of the annual amount of tolls received and monies expended by them. Proviso.

CHAPTER CLXXVII.

An ACT for the sale of two tracts of land to Ebenezer and Benjamin Slocum.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Secretary of the commonwealth to make a deed of conveyance to Ebenezer and Benjamin Slocum, &c.
 the secretary of the commonwealth be and he is hereby authorized and required to make a deed, conveying to Ebenezer and Benjamin Slocum the title of the commonwealth for two adjoining tracts of land in Luzerne county, one taken up in the name of George Fullerton; the other taken up in the name of

Andrew Caldwell, which said lands were sold by the state as the property of the late John Nicholson and purchased in by the commissioners appointed by the act of the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and six; *provided*, the said Ebenezer and Benjamin Slocum shall pay or secure to be paid within four years, to the treasurer of the state, one dollar per acre for said land.

CHAPTER CLXXVIII.

An ACT to enable the governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road from Millerstown through M^r Kessonsburg, and thence by Daniel Sprenkle's to the Franklin county line.

Names of commissioners.

Their duties.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Samuel Witherow, James Wilson, William M^r Millen, James M^r Kesson, William Money, and Robert Crooks, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several things hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, they shall on or before the first Monday in June next, procure two books and in each of them enter as follows: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company of the Millerstown and Franklin county line turnpike road, the sum of fifty dollars for every share of stock in the said company set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the president and managers of the said company in pursuance of an act of the general assembly, entitled, "An act to enable the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Millerstown through M^r Kessonsburg, and thence by Daniel Sprenkle's to the Franklin county line," and shall thereupon give notice in two of the public newspapers in Chambersburg, and one in Gettysburg, for one calendar month at least, of the times and places when and where the said books shall be kept open to receive subscriptions for the stock of the said company, at which respective times and places some two of the said commissioners shall attend, and permit and suffer all persons of lawful age who shall offer to subscribe in said books, in their own name or in the names of any other persons who shall duly authorize the same,*
